Brazil adopted the National Plan of Action – NPOA Seabirds, where are present the National Strategies to the seabirds conservation in Brazil. The main lines of the Plan include continuing and expanding research activities on foraging areas, capture of seabirds on fisheries and test mitigation measures and development new ones.

Brazil is also starting to organize the inclusion of seabirds bycatch experts in the national delegations to attend the RFMOs meetings, specially CCAMLR and ICCAT.

Brazil maintains the National on Bord Observer Programme - PROBORDO, coordinated by Special Secretariat of Aquiculture and Fishery of Presidency of Republic – SEAPR. This program covers the foreign vessels that are leased by Brazilian industries and also foresee future coverage for national vessels.

Projeto Albatroz, an NGO addressed to the seabirds conservation, also has its own Observer Program that covers basically national longline vessels and it is producing good data.
