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## 6. Education and public awareness

6.1 Has the Party conducted training or provided information for user audiences (eg scientists, fishers, etc)? Yes  
El Viceministerio de Pesquería, Ministerio de la Producción tiene a sus cargo el programa de capacitación Servicio de Extensión Pesquera Artesanal (ex Programa de Extensión Pesquera Artesanal), el cual viene ejecutando desde el 2006 en convenio con los Gobiernos Regionales. El objetivo del programa es promover la actividad pesquera artesanal, mediante acciones de sensibilización, asesoramiento y capacitación de sus agentes, en los mismos lugares donde desarrollan sus actividades. Dentro del componente de Buenas Prácticas Pesqueras, los extensionistas realizan acciones de sensibilización conservación de los recursos pesqueros y especies protegidas (aves, mamíferos y tortugas marinas). Se ha elaborado y distribuido material de información. La ONG ProDelphinus realizó durante el 2013 y parte del 2014, veinticinco talleres en 20 puertos con un total de 409 asistentes sobre temas como la conservación y la biología de las aves marinas, tortugas marinas y mamíferos marinos, así como la conservación marina. Ha brindado también entrenamiento a pescadores, a través de nueve talleres en 5 puertos para proporcionar material de capacitación y supervisión (por ejemplo, libros de registro, guías de identificación). Pescadores Industriales, ProDelphinus trabajó con la empresa pesquera TASA capacitando hasta el momento al 84.8% (800 pescadores

industriales de la TASA) de los tripulantes y capitanes en las sedes de Mollendo, Chimbote, Paita y Callao. También trabajaron con Cantabria capacitando a 35 de sus capitanes sobre identificación e importancia de aves, mamíferos y tortugas marinas. Pescadores artesanales; Pro Delphinus realiza constantes visitas a puertos a capacitar a pescadores artesanales sobre identificación e importancia de animales marinos, métodos de mitigación en pesca incidental en los puertos de Salaverry, Pucusana, Chorrillos, Salaverry, Chimbote, Máncora, Zorritos, Cancas, San José, Samanco, Chicama, Pacasmayo y Santa Rosa habiendo capacitado a 221 pescadores artesanales en el último año. Por su parte la ONG APECO, realiza la difusión de sus actividades y resultados de sus trabajos en diferentes plataformas: una página web dedicada a los pescadores con datos útiles para su faena de pesca y que hacer en caso de capturas incidentales, volantes y videos, estos últimos forman parte de la Biblioteca Ambiental Nacional del Ministerio del Ambiente - MINAM. <http://goo.gl/5gJBgH>

Pescadores Industriales, trabajó con la empresa pesquera TASA capacitando hasta el momento al 84.8% (800 pescadores industriales de la TASA) de los tripulantes y capitanes en las sedes de Mollendo, Chimbote, Paita y Callao. También trabajaron con Cantabria capacitando a 35 de sus capitanes sobre identificación e importancia de aves, mamíferos y tortugas marinas. ## **2. Species conservation**

*2.6 Has the Party introduced any new legal or policy instruments for species protection of albatrosses and petrels?*

Recently a classification and categorization list of legally protected threatened wildlife species has been approved (Supreme Decree No. 004-2014-MINAGRI) [*Decreto Supremo N° 004-2014-MINAGRI*]. This regulation includes 13 species of albatrosses and petrels listed in the First Annex of the Agreement (Anexo I del Acuerdo), maintaining the prohibition of the hunting, capture, possession, sale, the transport or exportation for commercial intent of all specimens, products and/or sub-products.

## **6. Education and public awareness**

*6.1 Has the party conducted training or provided information for user audiences (e.g. scientists, fishers, etc.)?*

Yes

The Department of Fishing [*Viceministerio de Pesquería*], a sub-division of the larger Department of Production [*Ministerio de la Producción*], is in charge of the training program Extension Service for Artisan Fishing [*Servicio de Extensión Pesquera Artesanal*] (previously known as the Artisan Fishing Extension Program [*ex Programa de Extensión Pesquera Artesanal*]), which has been running since 2006 in participation with Regional Governments. The objective of the project is to promote artisanal fishing activity, through awareness, advice and training programs for fishermen, directly where their work takes place. As part of Good Fishing Practices [*Buenas Prácticas Pesqueras*], extension service workers promote conservation

awareness of fishing resources and protected species (sea birds, marine mammals, and sea turtles). Educational materials have produced and distributed. During 2013 and the beginning of 2014 the NGO ProDelphinus held 25 workshops in 20 ports which attracted a total of 409 participants, and concentrated on areas such as the conservation and biology of sea birds, sea turtles and marine mammals, as well as marine conservation. They have also been able to provide training to fishermen, through nine workshops in five ports, in which they supplied training material and offered supervision (for example, logbooks, identification guides).

With regard to industrial fishing, ProDelphinus has worked with the fishing company TASA, and to date, has taught up 84.8% (800 industrial TASA fishermen) of the crews and captains in the main office of Mollendo, Chimbote, Paita and Callao. As well they work with Cantabria and have trained 35 of their captains in the identification and importance of sea birds, marine mammals and sea turtles.

With regard to artisanal fishing, ProDelphinus constantly makes visits to ports to train artisanal fishermen in the identification and importance of marine animals and in methods of bycatch mitigation in the ports of Salaverry, Pucusana, Chorrillos, Chimbote, Máncora, Zorritos, Cancas, San Jose, Samanco, Chicama, Pacasmayo and Santa Rosa. They have trained 221 artisanal fishermen in the last year. In turn the NGO APECO diversifies its activities and the results of its projects between different platforms such as: a web page aimed to be used by fishermen with useful data of fish harvesting and what to do in respect to bycatch, as well as leaflets and videos. *6.2 Has the Party conducted training or provided information to the general public?*

ProDelphinus training programs are designed as much for industrial fishermen as they are for Artisanal fishermen. With regard to Industrial Fishing, ProDelphinus has worked with the fishing company TASA, and to date, has taught up 84.8% (800 industrial TASA fishermen) of the crews and captains in the main office of Mollendo, Chimbote, Paita and Callao. As well they work with Cantabria and have trained 35 of their captains in the identification and importance of sea birds, marine mammals and sea turtles.

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
