Summary of Content:

RSN1/2007/8 – Drawing on the performance of Commission for the Conservation of Antarctic Marine Living Resources (CCAMLR) in reducing seabird bycatch through its ecosystem approach to fisheries management the ACAP Executive Secretary encouraged the adoption of this approach by other RFMOs and offered ACAP's assistance and expertise in addressing issues related to seabird bycatch.

Outcome (e.g. summary of relevant discussion, resolution, etc):

In the margins of this meeting the ACAP Executive Secretary met with the WCPFC Executive Secretary to finalise a draft MoU between the two organizations.

Discussions were held with other Executive Secretaries with a view to encouraging closer cooperation with ACAP through the development of both formal and informal mechanisms e.g. MoUs.

Outlook for Future ACAP Involvement:

Further involvement in the work of this group is encouraged as it provides an opportunity to develop relationships with all regional fishery bodies of relevance to ACAP.

Recommended Actions for ACAP:

 Continue engagement with the Secretariats of relevant regional fishery bodies with a view to influencing the adoption of measures that will support ACAP objectives.
